

ADDRESS

of the Anti-Crisis Headquarters for Economic Resilience of Ukraine

(approved at the meeting on December 23, 2025, Kyiv,

with the participation of representatives of the national associations, industrialists, entrepreneurs, employers, local communities, trade unions, the National Academy of Sciences, think tanks, war veterans' associations, and relevant sectoral public organisations)

Dear compatriots!

Defending its freedom and sovereignty in the fight against the Russian aggressor Ukraine is undergoing the most turbulent and tragic trials that have befallen it.

The people of Ukraine and the Armed Forces are demonstrating an unprecedented level of patriotism, courage and resilience.

Ukrainians have learned to live, defend their country and create in conditions of war.

Amid the full-scale war the struggle is not only on the front lines against an external enemy. It is equally important to overcome corruption, improve the quality of public administration and personal responsibility based on the rule of law and equality before the law.

The lack of consistent conscription measures under martial law, long-term programmes of reconstruction, national economic development, critical dependence on foreign aid, and one of the worst demographic situations in the world require maximum concentration of will, intellect and strength to preserve and develop Ukraine as a democratic, just and competitive State.

The above proves the urgent need to improve the functional efficiency of all branches of government in the context of martial law and post-war reconstruction in Ukraine, to restore professional standards and moral values in public administration, and to ensure zero tolerance for corruption.

The return of Ukrainian refugees to their homeland, the social rehabilitation of veterans, support for the families of wounded and fallen heroes, housing and jobs are our priorities and moral duty.

Democratic political process, free media, transparent public control over the actions of the authorities, and honest dialogue are all pre-requisites for both the stability and post-war recovery of our society. It is these conditions that will allow for transparent democratic elections at all levels.

Settlement of crucial socio-economic problems is only possible if the state pursues a new course towards creating a just and economically developed society.

The Anti-Crisis Headquarters considers it reasonable to implement the following measures within the framework of the Constitution of Ukraine:

1. Formation of the members of parliament coalition in the Verkhovna Rada of Ukraine for the transition period.

2. Formation of the coalition government for the transition period whose main tasks should be to prevent the exacerbation of the social and economic crisis and the risks of civil confrontation, to crack down on corruption and to develop and approve action programme for the Cabinet of Ministers of Ukraine during the transition period.

The formation of a coalition government should be based on the principles of experience, professionalism and state-centric approach.

3. Preparation and conduct of democratic, transparent elections of the President of Ukraine, the Verkhovna Rada of Ukraine and local self-government bodies.

4. Formation of legislative (representative) and executive bodies of power based on the results of the will of Ukrainian citizens.

5. Implementation of the Strategy for the post-war reconstruction and modernisation of Ukraine.

The implementation of the above initiatives must take into account the time factor, the limited resources of Ukraine and the need for comprehensive and coordinated actions by Ukraine, the United States and international partners at all stages of the Transition Period Programme.
